Kitchen Caddies

Are you using your kitchen caddy supplied by Council in 2020? The caddy can be used to store food scraps (including dairy, meat, bones, seafood, fruit and vegetables), coffee grounds, tea bags and tissues for disposal in your green organics bin.



As over 30% of household waste is generally food waste, it is important to keep as much of this waste as we can out of blue landfill bins.

Campbelltown residents dispose of over 3,000 tonnes of food waste each year (the equivalent of several fridges' worth per person). When disposed of in your blue bin, this waste generates harmful gas when it rots untreated, and also costs ratepayers around 85% more to send to landfill. When disposed of via your green bin, food waste can be composted and turned into mulch.

Have you run out of compostable bags for your caddy? All households are entitled to one free roll of 150 compostable bags each year. Collect yours from Council's office during office hours.

Draft Cats By-Law 2022

Earlier this year, Council endorsed a draft Cats By-Law for consideration by the Dog and Cat Management Board.

Staff subsequently sought feedback from the Board, as well as the Animal Welfare League and RSPCA. Council will consider the feedback received and then we will consult with our Community.

If the By-Law is adopted, cat owners would be required to:

- Keep cat(s) within property boundaries between 9pm and 7am.
 If a cat is away from home, the owner needs to keep it under effective control.
- From 1 January 2024, cats will need to be kept within property boundaries at all times unless under effective control.
- Registration of their pet(s) on the DACO (www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au) to help keep them safe and to comply with State legislation.
- If more than 2 cats are owned or kept on premises, arrange a permit from Council (note, permits won't be available until the by-law is adopted).
 Responsible pet owners will be able to keep more than 2 cats.
- Any cat that leaves an owner's premises must be identifiable by a collar around its neck and a tag with the name of its owner or person responsible for the cat and either the owner's address or telephone number.
- Cat cannot cause a nuisance through making noise, odour, defecation or urination on other people's premises to an unreasonable level.
