Athelstone Recreational Reserve

Location: Lower Athelstone Road, Athelstone Features: Suitable for ball games, soccer goals, playground, car parking, natural setting,

2 Campbelltown Memorial Oval

Location: Corner Darley and Lower N E Roads, Paradise Features: Suitable for ball games, car parking, football goals, toilets

3 Campbelltown Skate Park

Location: Darley Road, Paradise Features: Intermediate level skate park, lighting until 10pm, BBQ, picnic area, toilets, basketball ring

4 Charlesworth Park

Location: Reserve Road, Campbelltown

Features: Playground, basketball, tennis, cricket and soccer facilities, fitness track and equipment, BBQ, picnic area, drinking fountain

5 Clarke Crescent Reserve

Location: Clarke Crescent, Paradise Features: Natural setting, drinking fountain, walking, cycling trail, playground, toilets, BBQ, picnic area

6 Daly Oval

Location: Fisher Street, Magill **Features:** Area for ball games, football goals, cricket/netball courts, playground, BBQ, picnic area, drinking fountains

7 Denis Morrissey Park

Location: St Bernard's Road, Hectorville Features: Natural creek setting, toilets, fenced dog park, suitable for ball games, picnic area, playground

8 Gums Recreational Ground

Location: Shakespeare Avenue, Tranmere Features: Playground, wheelchair access, public toilets, BBQ, picnic area, creek, area for ball games, war memorial

9 Gurners Reserve

Location: Leabrook Drive, Rostrevor Features: Playground, basketball court, grass area, shade trees, drinking fountain, BBQ, picnic area, climbing trees

10 Horwood Avenue Playground

Location: Horwood Avenue, Rostrevor Features: Seating, natural setting, creek, playground, walking and cycling trail

1 Lochiel Park

Location: Lochend Drive, Campbelltown Features: Picnic area, BBQ, walking and cycling trail, toilet, playground, basketball court, fitness track

12 Lovell Reserve

Location: Ryan Avenue, Athelstone Features: Creek, basketball and tennis facilities, playground, toilets, BBQ, picnic area, drinking fountain

B Max Amber Sports Field

Location: George Street and Schultz Road, Athelstone Features: Football, cricket, tennis and soccer facilities. Creek, walking trail, natural setting, car parking

W Murray Park Oval and Lorne Ave Tennis Courts

Location: Balmoral and Lorne Avenue, Magill Features: Cricket, soccer and tennis facilities, playground, toilets, suitable for ball games

15 Nightingale Reserve

Location: Woodforde Road, Magill Features: Creek, playground, tennis and basketball facilities, toilets, BBQ, picnic area, interpretive trail

16 Oakdale Avenue Reserve

Location: Oakdale Avenue, Newton Features: Playground, basketball court, bocce pitch, picnic area, BBQ, drinking fountain, fitness equipment

Spencer Street Reserve

Location: Spencer Street, Campbelltown Features: Fully enclosed park, playground, grass area, seating

18 Thorndon Park

Location: Hamilton Terrace, Paradise Features: Access for all playground, table tennis, liberty swing, chess, BBQ, picnic area, walking trails, wetlands, toilets

19 Unity Park

Location: Ballater Avenue, Campbelltown Features: Access for all fenced playground, basketball court, suitable for ball games, BBQ, picnic area, drinking fountain

20 Steve Woodcock and Foxfield Oval Reserves

Location: Maryvale Road, Athelstone Features: Soccer, tennis and cricket facilities, playground, toilets, picnic area, drinking fountain, creek

Playing outdoors in nature is important for kids. It provides opportunities to:


- connect with family

20 things to do with your kids outdoors

- 1. Climb the Moreton Bay fig trees at Gurners reserve.
- 2. Build an outdoor cubby or tree house.
- 3. Wind your way through the trail at Nightingale Reserve.
- 4. Catch a yabby or tadpole in a creek then release it.
- 5. Borrow "be active" equipment from the Campbelltown Toy Library and use at your local park.
- 6. Roll down a hill.
- 7. Picnic under the beautiful old trees at The Gums.
- 8. Make something with things you find at the park.
- 9. Discover great parks and places through Geocaching (Geocaching kits available at Campbelltown library).
- 10. Explore a dry creek bed.
- 11. Take your dog to the Denis Morrissey Four Paws Park.
- 12. Play "spotlight" (a night time game with torches).
- 13. Have a leaf race in the waterway at Thorndon Park.
- 14. Ride your bike on a dirt track.
- 15. Discover the Fourth Creek to Linear Park trail.
- 16. Fly a kite in an open space.
- 17. Use a magnifying glass to spot creatures under rocks.
- 18. Let your kids win a race around the track at Daly Oval. 19. Make a mud pie.
- 20. Cook a meal on the public BBQ while the kids play at Charlesworth Park.





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
