MAGILL VILLAGE UPDATE

Good afternoon,

Please find an update on what is happening in Magill Village.

## POWER LINE UNDERGROUNDING WORKS

As you are aware, SA Power Networks commenced the power line

undergrounding works along Magill Road in January 2019. We were previously advised by SAPN that works would not commence on the City of Burnside's side of Magill Road until April 2019.

However, SAPN now need to install a switching cabinet on the western side of the footpath along Penfold Road near the Magill Road intersection. This was not originally anticipated by SAPN. As a result, we were recently notified that works will now occur on the southern side of Magill Road as follows:

26 – 29 February: from the Magill Grain Store to the western corner of the Magill / Penfold Roads intersection; and

5 – 7 March: from the western corner of the Magill / Penfold Roads intersection to the eastern corner of the Pepper Street Arts Centre.

SAPN have confirmed that this is entirely due to the unanticipated need to relocate the switching cabinet, and that works on the southern side of Magill Road will be limited to this section until April as previously advised.

A reminder that the hours of work will be Monday to Friday, 7 pm to 6 am. To reduce impacts to you, all high noise generating work such as concrete cutting and excavating will take place between 7 pm and 10 pm.

## **SENSORS**

The collaboration of five councils and the University of Adelaide have created a metropolitan-wide sensor network to assist councils, businesses and the community solve local problems.

This is part of the Connected Cities project which will assist the Cities of Burnside and Campbelltown to analyse trends in pedestrian movement and to make evidence-based decisions when planning the redevelopment and activation of the Magill Village Precinct.

The pedestrian sensors are small (size of a mobile phone), unobtrusive devices which use radio frequency to detect mobile phones and therefore determine the number of pedestrians on the footpath within a set radius at designated time intervals.

This project will initially run for a 12 month trial period.

Four sensors will be located at Magill Village. Four of the businesses have been identified and the Cities of Burnside and Campbelltown are working with these

businesses on the initiative.
