#### **2022 Council Elections**

Participating in Council Elections is one way you can make a difference to everyday life in our Community. The voting period for the 2022 Council Elections is from Friday 14 October to 5:00pm, Thursday 10 November 2022.

Council congratulates Jill Whittaker (Mayor), and Therese Britton La-Salle and John Flynn (Woodforde Ward) who have been elected (unopposed).

A postal vote will be undertaken to elect Councillors for the remaining four wards. Enrolled voters in the Gorge, Hectorville, Newton and River wards will receive a voting package through the mail in mid-October. The voting package will include a ward ballot paper, a candidate profile brochure, a ballot paper envelope to be signed, a reply paid envelope and a postal voting guide. To vote, you need to complete the ballot paper in accordance with the voting guide, seal it in the signed ballot paper envelope and return your voting papers so that they are received by close of voting at 5pm, Thursday 10 November 2022. You can post your ballot papers in the reply paid envelope or drop them into the Council office and put them in the ballot box. Election results will be declared in mid-November.

#### **Fire Danger Season**

#### **Prepare Your Property**

Fire Danger Season generally runs from 1 December to 30 April. Ensure your property is bushfire ready:

- Maintain lawns and other grasses on your property no longer than 10cm/4 inches
- Remove dead branches, leaves and undergrowth
- Prune tree limbs that are less than two metres above ground
- Remove bark, heavy mulch, wood piles and other flammable materials
- Keep your gutters clear
- Keep flammable chemicals in an enclosed shed away from your house.

#### **New Australian Fire Danger Rating System**

Changes have been made to Australia's Fire Danger Rating System to help Australians make decisions on days of high fire danger. There are now nationally consistent colours and terminology to make it easier to understand the level of threat and what you need to do to stay safe.

The new rating system has four levels:

FIRE DANGER RATING	WHAT DOES IT MEAN?	WHAT SHOULD YOU DO?
MODERATE	Most fires can be controlled	Plan and prepare
HIGH	Fires can be dangerous	Be ready to act
EXTREME	Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous	Take action now to protect your life and property
CATASTROPHIC	If a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost	For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas
