- Offers an accessible and enjoyable shopping experience in a safe and friendly environment.



What Does The Project Involve?

- Expected to take 10 -11 months to complete the undergrounding work (subject to weather condition)
- Landscaping and other street beautification works will be carried out after the undergrounding works are completed
- Work in sections of approximately 100-150 metres of roadway at any time
- Maintaining two lanes in each direction (where possible)
- Working hours between 9:00am 3:00pm
- Nightwork is expected in some section between 7pm to 7am
- Speed reductions will be in place to 40km/h






Typical Traffic Management of 150m

How Will This Construction Affect You?

- Access to properties/businesses will be restricted
- Access to on street and off street parking will be restricted
- Bike lane will be closed
- Footpaths will be slightly narrower
- Road crossings will be impacted
- Bus stops will be temporarily impacted
- Electricity may need to be turned off for the safety of workers
- Construction works will be in front of properties/businesses

Proposed Temporary Internal Access Enlargement




What Challenges We Face For The Creation of Temporary Internal Access?

- Some businesses will have fewer carparks or will have no carparks in front of their properties
- Change in levels (drop/fall) between carparks
 For example :
 - (a) Between The Cheesecake Shop and KE Skilton & Associates Pty Ltd
 - (b) Spartan Electrical and Iron World Fitness
- Concrete Island
- Undercroft carpark at Spartan Electrical
- Retaining walls between various businesses
- Garden beds, Sewer Main Pit, Water Meter









Campbelltown City Council is upgrading the Campbelltown Village precinct (Lower North East Road between Hill Street and Church Road) to improve amenity of the public realm and streetscape.

Works will be conducted in the following stages:

- · undergrounding power lines
- · upgrading footpaths
- · landscaping and installing public art and street furniture.

Undergrounding of power lines will commence in late February 2019. Traffic restrictions may commence any time from mid-February 2019 as work progresses.

Campbelltown Village is facing increasing pressure and competition from other shopping areas and requires an upgrade to revitalise the precinct. There is a strong need to improve the amenity of the shopping area's public realm and the streetscape of Lower North East Road.

Council adopted a Master Plan in 2011 to revitalise the precinct including undergrounding of the overhead power lines that clutter the streetscape vista, improving the pedestrian experience, creation of a slip lane from Hill Street to Lower North East Road and improving the streetscape including street tree planting and public art.
