

HOUSERULES

The work carried out in the Repair Café is performed free of charge on a voluntary basis by Volunteer Repairers.

Visitors work with the skilled Volunteer Repairers to carry out the repairs together – helping and learning along the way.

Visitors bringing broken items for repair do so at their own risk and repairs are not always guaranteed.

A voluntary donation is greatly appreciated to help sustain the Repair Café.

In general, replacement parts or any use of new materials such as buttons, zips, patches etc must be supplied by visitors.

Volunteer Repairers making repairs offer no guarantee for the repairs carried out and are not liable if objects that are repaired in the Repair Café turn out not to work properly at home.

Volunteer Repairers are entitled to refuse to repair certain objects or garments (for example, if they contain lead, asbestos are unclean or if the task is classified as an alteration)

Volunteer Repairers are not obliged to reassemble disassembled appliances that cannot be repaired.

Visitors to the Repair Café are solely responsible for their items at all times and for tidy removal of items brought in that could not be repaired.

To reduce wait times, a Volunteer Repairer will work on only ONE item per visitor. Visitors will join the back of the queue for additional items to be fixed.

Everyone cooperates with the registration process, waiting line and repair work.
