



Social Programs

Our social programs provide opportunities for those at risk of social isolation to stay active and connected to the community by providing engaging and meaningful activities. The program aims to support happy and healthy lifestyles and encourages lifelong learning.

We offer the following regular programs:

Bus Trips

The bus trips are designed for Campbelltown HSP eligible residents who may have limited transport options to visit and enjoy local and regional activities and interests. Bookings are limited.

Coffee Club

Coffee Clubs meet fortnightly for an hour either for morning or afternoon tea at local cafes. The Clubs provide an opportunity to connect with other people in a small group setting while enjoying a coffee at various cafes in the City of Campbelltown. Bookings are restricted to clients living alone.

Fees

All services and programs are subject to fees. You will be advised of your contribution before commencement of a service or program. Campbelltown HSP has developed criteria for a fee waiver to assist people who have limited capacity to pay for services. Inability to pay will not preclude people from accessing services.

How do I access services and programs?

Frail older people (65 years and over) or for ATSI people (50 years and over)

- If you are a new client or require a new service type you will need to register with My Aged Care on 1800 200 422 and advise them that Campbelltown City Council is your preferred provider.

Younger people with a disability (under 65 years) or for ATSI People (under 50 years)

Campbelltown HSP provides a range of services for frail older people and younger people with a disability to be able to continue living independently in their own homes and within the community.

The Program is jointly funded by the Australian Government Department of Health and the Government of South Australia Department for Communities and Social Inclusion and the City of Campbelltown.

Eligibility Criteria

- People who reside in the Campbelltown City Council
- Have difficulty performing daily activities without assistance
- Are at risk of admission to a long term residential care facility
- Frail older person (65 years and over) or for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) people (50 years and over)
- Younger person with a disability (under 65 years) or for ATSI people (under 50 years)

Services on offer

Cleaning

- Basic short-term domestic cleaning or flexible home help can be offered
- Annual spring clean

Shopping

- Provide local transport and assistance for grocery or personal shopping (Available on a fortnightly basis)
- Assisted Shopping
- Shopping from a list
- Provide a shopping from home booklet

Home Maintenance

The Home Support program provides essential minor home maintenance to ensure your home is in a safe and habitable condition.

- Replacing light bulbs
- Replacing smoke alarm batteries
- Minor plumbing
- Minor electrical
- Rubbish removal (max 4x4 trailer load)
- Assistance with hard waste kerbside collection
- Basic gardening
- Basic handyman services
- Gutter cleaning
- Window cleaning

Please note: Some maintenance services may not be available for Strata Title, SA Housing Properties, rental homes, retirement villages or group housing.

Home Modifications

- Minor home modifications are provided to improve safety and accessibility.
- Grab rails, banister rails, half steps, ramps (Occupational Therapist assessment is required prior to installation)
- Hand held shower set
- Door shields
- Key safe
- Magnetic door catches
- Basic security lock installation
- Door reversals
- Bath covers (melamine)

Transport

All Campbelltown HSP transport services are provided by our dedicated volunteers and subject to volunteer availability. Transport is available for clients with limited transport options and priority is given to daily essential needs (medical and shopping transport). Subsidised taxi vouchers may be provided when no alternative options are available.
