The Federal Government new Support at Home program will now be implemented from 1 July 2025. An extra 12 months will allow time to refine the program, with input from experts across a range of design elements and further consultation with older people and providers. The 1 July 2025 start date will also ensure providers are well prepared for the reforms and avoid disruption for care recipients.

Tell your Story: Seeking Stories and Experiences of Ageism

Council is developing a training tool for Local Government staff that focuses on the ageist assumptions and unconscious bias that impacts older people in our community every day. As part of this project, we want to share stories of older people in our community who have been treated in negative ways solely because of their age.



An Example

In a customer service environment, an older person begins a conversation with the customer service officer. The officer begins to speak in a very slow, loud and condescending manner to the older person, making assumptions that the older person is hard of hearing and has difficulties understanding. This decision is made purely based upon the assumptions that because of their age, they need to be spoken to in this way. The behaviour makes the older person feel upset, embarrassed and inadequate.

Your story might be something that has happened as part of a customer service experience, in the workplace or in a voluntary role, whilst exercising and keeping fit, using technology, or just going about your daily business. SCAM ALERT

Fake mySAGOV account e-mail

Service SA has been advised that an email is in circulation requesting that customers update their mySAGOV account.

- These emails are not legitimate and have been reported to the departments ICT Security Team.
- This is a scam and Service SA will not initiate contact with a customer to update their mySAGOV account details.
- If you receive this email, do not visit the "click here" link and immediately delete it.

New myGOV Scam

Scammers are attempting to take advantage of the Budget night with a false offer of a bonus payment from the Australian Government. People are receiving a SMS message which pretends to be from MyGov advising of a one-off payment to help with living expenses. The message includes a fake internet link to myGov.

- there is no \$750 payment on offer
- if they receive a SMS like this, do not click on the link
- text messages from myGov will never include an internet link
- all legitimate myGov messages can be accessed from the customer's myGov inbox.

Leek & butter bean soup with crispy kale & bacon

Butter beans give this a dairy-free, healthy soup a creamy texture and the starchy liquid from the can helps to thicken it into a comforting supper. (Recipe from BBQ Good Food). Serves 4.

Ingredients

4 tsp olive oil

500g leeks, sliced

4 Thyme sprigs, leaves picked

2 x 400g cans butter beans

500ml vegetable bouillon stock

2 tsp wholegrain mustard

½ small pack flat-leaf parsley

3 rashers streaky bacon

40g chopped kale, any tough stems removed

25g hazelnuts, roughly chopped (can use any nuts)



Instructions

- 1. Heat 1 tbsp oil in a large saucepan over a low heat. Add the leeks, thyme and seasoning. Cover and cook for 15 mins until softened, adding a splash of water if the leeks start to stick. Add the butter beans with the water from the cans, the stock and mustard. Bring to the boil and simmer for 3-4 mins until hot. Blend the soup in a food processor or with a stick blender, stir through parsley and season.
- 2. Cook bacon for 3-4 mins until crispy, then set aside to cool. Add 1 tsp oil to the pan, and tip in the kale and hazelnuts. Cook for 2 mins, stirring until the kale is crisping at the edges and the hazelnuts are toasted. Cut the bacon into small pieces, then stir into the kale mixture.
- Reheat the soup, adding a splash of water if it is too thick. Serve in bowls sprinkled with the bacon & kale mixture.
