Magill Road Asphalt Treatment Trial

The redevelopment of Magill Road is a joint project between the City of Burnside and Campbelltown City Council with funding from the Federal and State Governments to deliver a revitalised streetscape in an important mixed-use precinct.

The redevelopment will rejuvenate over one kilometre of Magill Road (between Norton Summit Road and Rosedale Place), with particular focus in creating a 'Village Heart' on the retail strip between the Tower Hotel (just east of the St Bernards Road intersection) and Carey Street.

What is happening?

As part of the project, the partnering Councils with the support of the Department of Infrastructure and Transport are pursuing a stamped asphalt feature finish on the road in the 'Village Heart' and 'entrance statements' at both the eastern and western ends of the precinct.

A trial section of the stamped asphalt finish will be installed on Magill Road to the east of Vine Street to demonstrate the product meets key criteria, including durability and performance, notably its skid resistance. The field trial will be installed between the two driveway entrances servicing the property at 210 Magill Road and will cover the width of the road (see map location below).



When will this happen?

Installation is expected to be around or shortly after 21 April 2021 (weather permitting).

If the trial is successful, the road surface treatment will remain in place to serve as a new 'entrance statement' as part of the upcoming Magill Road redevelopment.

How does this affect me?

There may be traffic controls in place for one to two days when the road surface treatment is installed.

During these works there will be vehicles, machinery and workers on and around the roadway. There will be some unavoidable noise associated with this work, however all reasonable and practical measures will be taken to minimise disturbance.

After installation, it is not expected there will be any other changes to traffic conditions, such as speed limits.
